


Maximise daylight's potential with smart, integrated design

In the same way an extension can transform your home, VELUX roof windows can bring more natural daylight in to transform your extension.

Making natural light work for you

When building your extension, bi-fold or patio doors and any vertical windows are usually positioned further away from your original room. As a result, natural daylight - even on the brightest days - often struggles to reach deep into your home. Too often, the original room ends up relying on artificial lighting to counteract the gloom.

By using VELUX roof windows, you can bring even more natural daylight deeper into your home.

With the right design choices, you can maximise the space's potential and make it work better for your family.




Brighter spaces start with smarter design

To maximise the benefits of daylight, it's essential to consider key design factors early in the planning process. The size, shape and orientation of the building - along with its exact location and local climate - play an important role in optimising natural light. The building components such as façade windows and roof windows should be carefully integrated to enhance daylight distribution.

By prioritising daylight from the outset, you can create brighter, more energy-efficient and comfortable spaces.

Combining VELUX roof windows with vertical glazing is essential as it allows daylight to enter from all different angles. By following the daylight rule, you can ensure your roof windows bring daylight deeper into your home, reaching the original rooms. For optimal comfort, the glazed areas should represent 15-20% of the room's overall floor space. Don't lose out on daylight – follow the daylight rule.

Being clever with daylight design

The more roof windows you install (and the bigger they are), the more natural daylight you will enjoy in your new extension.

It's not just about the amount of light - where you place your roof windows also impacts how it flows through your space. Discuss the best positioning with your architect or builder to maximise daylight in your extension.

As well as considering how and where daylight enters, the internal finishes you choose are also important. Light-coloured walls, ceilings and floors help reflect and distribute natural light, brightening areas that might otherwise be quite dark.


If your new extension will serve as a kitchen, effective ventilation becomes even more essential to ensure air quality and comfort.

"I think when we envisioned this room, we knew we were going to love it, but we love it so much more than we ever thought we would!", Tiffany explained.






A house with promising opportunities

We can't stress enough how important it is to bring in a good professional as early as possible. Not only will they steer your project from start to finish, and work within your budget to help you get the extension you want, but they'll also come up with ideas that you might not have considered.

Here's a quick checklist of things to consider before you start.

Work out your budget

It may seem obvious, but it's essential to carefully assess all aspects of your project and determine your budget. You should allow a 15% contingency to account for any unforeseen costs.

Find professional help

Ask your friends and family for architect or builder recommendations and check that they have relevant experience with home extensions.

Building regulations

You might need to submit drawings to your local Building Control
Department to ensure your extension meets building regulations and that it's
safe and legal. If you're planning major structural changes to your property,
such as knocking down a wall, you may need to carry out a structural survey.

Set a time frame

This will help you manage both your expectations and, more importantly, your budget. It will also assist the professionals you're working with.
