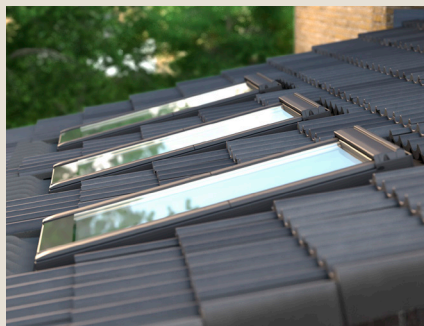
We recommend your glazing is at least 20% of the floor space - fitting multiple roof window solutions will help you maximise daylight and achieve this.

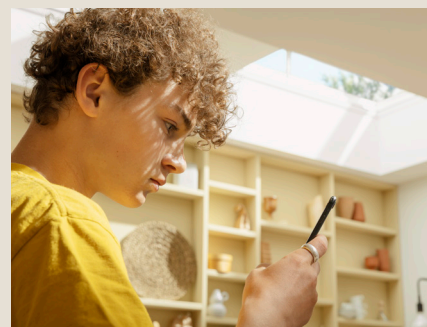
